The amount of time and attention which in the course of his life the author has given to Small-pox and Vaccination is indicated by the subjoined note of previous work. The present is probably his final contribution to the study of the subject. In that view he has endeavoured in the first lecture to survey shortly the statistical and epidemiological history of Small-pox in modern times. Much of the second lecture is devoted to rebutment of a contention that infantile vaccination, whilst protecting the individual, makes Small-pox so mild and so difficult to recognize where it is not entirely prevented, that the result is such spread of infection from missed cases as to render the practice, on balance, disadvantageous to the community.
